THE ORMISTON GARDENS



Ormiston Gardens have become a popular attraction in East Fairmount Park. In 2019 and 2020, the Royal Heritage Society received funding from the Philadelphia Committee of the Garden Club of America to improve the existing gardens at Ormiston and add an "alphabet garden" for children. The gardens have enhanced community outreach by providing:

- Educational events and projects for schools and after school.
- Garden activities for children and families.
- Programs that highlight the British influences on colonial America.
- Opportunities for community members to plan and care for an evolving garden.
- An attractive venue for meetings and other community events.

THE HOUSE



Visit the garden all year long to see the flowers, herbs and vegetables we are growing. Walk the Boxer Trail to the river, or to view other mansions in East Fairmount Park. Come inside when the mansion is open to visitors.

In the living room on the main floor, see a picture of Edward Burd, who built the mansion in 1798. In the dining room, see a picture of King George III, who was king during the Revolutionary War. Through the trees off the back porch you can glimpse the Schuylkill River.

Go downstairs to the **Scottish kitchen.** Indoor kitchens were rare in colonial times. Today, the room is used for special events and exhibits. After Covid, we hope to use the space year round for children's programs where we can read books about gardening or colonial history, and do related crafts and activities. Take time to peek inside the old dollhouse

The third floor has a functional kitchen and meeting rooms for staging get-togethers like parties and teas. Take your picture with a lifesize cutout of Queen Elizabeth II, the longest reigning monarch in British history (70 years!)


